



LION'S TALE

*A nod to the iconic lion statues
at The New York Public Library,
"Patience" and "Fortitude."*

The front staircase of The New York Public Library on 5th Avenue is flanked by two marble lion statues, originally installed in 1911, and named "Leo Astor" and "Leo Lenox" after the Library's founders. Later, Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia (yes, like the airport) named them "Patience" and "Fortitude" to symbolize the resilience of the city and its residents during the Great Depression. "Patience" is the statue on the left, and "Fortitude" stands to the right of the entrance.
