

This tree-lined street in one of Brooklyn's most historic neighborhoods is one of three parallel streets named after fruit (the others are Orange and Pineapple). They were originally named by local resident Lady Middagh, a descendant of one of the earliest families to settle the area, who found the practice of naming streets after aristocratic families pretentious. Cranberry Street was made famous as the location of the 1987 film Moonstruck which featured a brownstone house at the corner of Cranberry and Willow Streets.
