

FOOD WASTE COMPOSTING FOR BUSINESSES

Washington Organics Law



As of January 1, 2026, restaurants in Federal Way are required to compost food scraps per Washington State Law HB1799.

Any business with 96 gallons of food waste weekly must have compost collection.

Steps for Businesses:

- 1 Set up service.** Two companies provide outside compost carts and dumpsters and collect weekly. Contact for rates.
 - Waste Management: wmnorthwest.com/federalway
 - Cedar Grove: cedar-grove.com
- 2 Designate indoor collection.** Order materials including:
 - Compost containers (green preferred)
 - Signs and stickers
 - Approved compostable liners (optional)
- 3 Train staff** on what is compostable to sort correctly. Train staff to empty inside containers into outside carts at least once a day. Contact the City of Federal Way for training support.

MUST BE UNCOATED (NOT SHINY OR PLASTIC-LINED)



Items accepted for compost collection are food scraps (including meat, dairy & bones), and non-shiny paper products.

In Federal Way, items are taken to a local compost facility to be turned into soil in 8 weeks!
